“So Great a Cloud of Witnesses”

“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.” (Hebrews 12:1-2)

I have always loved this image from Hebrews, “surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses” cheering us on as we follow Jesus, reminding us that we can fight the good fight and finish the race. I am not a runner, but I have always thought of the Christian life like a marathon race. Sometimes it is long and difficult and sometimes the running seems easier, but the hope is to finish the race.

This cloud of witnesses refers to the saints, the living saints both here and now and those with God—in the presence of God. Each Sunday we sing along with the saints as we gather together in our place of worship. Remember the words I say in the communion liturgy: “with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn: Holy, Holy, Holy!”

When you consider all these cheering witnesses, urging us to live our faith, then we may “lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race that is set before us”, and we may continue with full assurance looking to Jesus who gave us faith and who promises to complete our faith.

One more thing to consider: you, too, are part of this cloud of witnesses! Who are you going to encourage to stay in the race of faith today?
