“The Season of Lent”

The season of Lent is early this year. Ash Wednesday is February 10th, and the First Sunday in Lent is February 14th, which also happens to be Valentine’s Day. Our thoughts go to love, and I am reminded of this verse in Romans, “God demonstrates love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.”

You may want to mark your calendar with these Lenten events:

- ◆ Ash Wednesday Breakfast and Service at 9:30 AM
- ◆ Ash Wednesday Worship with Imposition of Ashes at 7:00 PM
- ◆ Lenten Worship Services each Wednesday at 7:00 PM with Soup Supper at 6:00 PM (A couple of people have suggested to me that we

offer more variety of food from week to week instead of soup and bread. Tell me what you think!)

This year during Lent I will focus on the theme “Living as God’s Beloved Child”. I would like to form several small groups with 4-6 people in each group to study portions of Luther’s Small Catechism and the Gospel Lesson from the appointed Sunday lectionary during Lent. My vision is that a few people will be inspired to serve as “mentors” or “catechists” who would meet with people wanting to explore the faith of the church during the year. Pray about this and let me know of your interest. I will post sign-ups in the narthex about a week before Ash Wednesday.

This year will be the 3rd time we do the Easter Vigil

Service on Saturday night before Easter morning. This is a beautiful service, which celebrates Christ’s Passover from death to life with readings, rich liturgical actions, and celebration of Holy Communion. Following the service we break the Lenten Fast with desserts and champagne. If you have not attended it yet, I encourage you to take part this year.

Finally, I am so excited to welcome Tracy McClure as our new Associate in Ministry – Youth Coordinator. Please pray for her as she gets acquainted with us, and as she begins to meet our youth. Parents, please encourage your children to introduce themselves to Tracy. She has lots of great ideas for our youth, and I know you will appreciate her ministry.

ASH WEDNESDAY BREAKFAST SERVICE: We start Lent with a 9:30 AM worship service on February 10th, that includes the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. After the worship, there will be a Continental Breakfast with hard-boiled eggs, coffee cakes and beverages. A sign-up sheet will be in the narthex early in February, so we will know how much food to prepare. Don't worry if you forget to sign-up—just come anyway!

ASH WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICE on February 10th will be at 7:00 PM and includes the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

SOUP SUPPERS, beginning on February 17th, will start at 6:00 PM. You don't have to be here right at 6:00—suppers will be served until about 6:40.

WEDNESDAY EVENING LENTEN SERVICES, beginning on February 17th, start at 7:00 PM.

PALM SUNDAY, March 20th, worship at 8:30 AM (Traditional) and 10:30 AM (Contemporary).

MAUNDY THURSDAY, March 24th, worship at 7:00 PM.

GOOD FRIDAY, March 25th, worship at 7:00 PM.

AN EASTER VIGIL, March 26th, worship at 7:00 PM. This service will begin outside at a small fire and then move inside.

EASTER SUNDAY, March 27th, worship at 8:30 AM (Traditional) and 10:30 AM (Contemporary).
