## Pastor Joel

**John 20:21-22 “Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.’ When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit.’”**

Jesus commissioned the first disciples on the first Easter evening to share the news of his resurrection. After assuring them of the gift of peace, Jesus sent them, just as the Father had sent him.

There was no time to waste. The urgent message needed to be shared with the world, beginning in Jerusalem, and extending to the uttermost ends of all the nations. Seems a little presumptuous doesn't it that Jesus would choose a tiny band of uneducated followers who were hiding behind closed doors to share the message of his resurrection?

But Jesus did not send them out into the community and into the world alone. The text says, “He breathed on them and said to them, receive the Holy Spirit.” They went out filled with the

power and the person of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit would give them the words to say and the courage to say them!

Beloved of Christ Lutheran! Do you ever feel like hiding behind the doors of our church? Do you ever sense that we are gathering in what some have called the “Holy Huddle”? Christ calls us as well to go with the message of his resurrection. And we too have been filled with the power and the person of the Holy Spirit. We do not go alone – God goes with us, and gives us courage to share the greatest message ever proclaimed: Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!

Here's an idea. Invite a couple of friends or neighbors to come with you to our Wednesday night service at 7:00 PM. Pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to speak a word of hope and encouragement to them as they hear the Word and share the supper. Let your light shine and let the love of God draw them to Jesus!

### Mission Quilters-Paula Spengler

Mission Quilters and friends attended the 40th annual Friends of Lutheran World Relief Luncheon on Friday April 28 at Avalon Banquets in Elk Grove Village. The 16 who attended from CLC learned about the work of LWR beyond the quilt and kit ministry. The guest speaker, Geri Sicola, vice president for Strategic Partnerships and External Relations, where she oversees philanthropic engagement, marketing and creative services and new business development. She recently returned from Peru where she assisted in exploring ways that LWR may help farmers become more productive and sustain their families. She told stories of how LWR has many interests in working with countries to promote good farming practices, education and water safety. During our time together, congregations displayed quilts with comments on how each of the 24 congregations represented meet each month, the number of quilts produced each year, how supplies and costs are handled. The 134 persons gathered also had an opportunity to purchase Fair Trade coffee, tea, and chocolate from Our Savours’s L.C. in Arlington Heights who have an active shop. Also Motif, a Fair Trade representative who supplies kit bags made in Bangladesh and sold to congregations collecting LWR school kit items. Each congregation also received a resource packet containing the latest of information from LWR.
