“Extending the Common Good”

“Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.” 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

Each of you is called by God to share your gifts and talents for the benefit of the congregation, and in a very real sense, for the benefit of the whole church. Paul uses the words “common good” to describe this calling.

The thought of “What’s in it for me?” is not part of

God’s plan for the congregation. The Holy Spirit gathers us together to do what we cannot and should not try to do alone. Each of us is an important part of the congregation, and no job, no matter how big or small, is insignificant.

This month I ask you to pay special attention to our children. Encourage them and thank them when they help out. If they ask you, “can I help?” tell them yes, and find a way to include them. Show extra patience and remember that you were once little yourself. It is not always about getting the job done quickly; it is also about the relationships that are nurtured in the process

of working together.

My mother baked bread and other goodies on Saturday mornings. I treasure those memories of trying to knead the dough, sprinkling the brown sugar on the pecan rolls, and waiting for the cinnamon strips to come out of the oven. My mother could have finished her work much quicker but she let her little boy try to help. She made me feel useful and even a little important.

When we as a congregation grow this kind of humble and loving attitude, people will be drawn to us. We will work together for the “common good”.

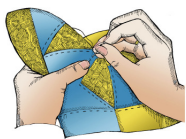

In addition to the work Rev. Reinke does with local congregations in southern Wisconsin, he is also a missionary at Lutheran Deaf Out-

reach, which provides resources and training designed for Deaf people to learn more about the love of Jesus and to share that love with others. He also leads the Jesus Signs Workshops across the states. (The next one is in October at Immanuel Lutheran, East Dundee. I'm already signed up to attend!) He is a dynamic speaker and I think you will be greatly moved by his presentation. The services on the 25th will be interpreted in ASL so this is a wonderful opportunity for you to reach out to any of the Deaf people you might know to come and worship with us that day.

Mission Quilt Sunday is September 25th. Quilts made in the past year will be displayed across our pews and then shipped to selected countries through the auspices of Lutheran World Relief. Thanks to many for your participation in this mission quilt project. A donation of \$2.25/quilt for shipping expenses is appreciated. Because our

boxes are marked with a barcode, we are informed where our quilts are being distributed. Please stop by the display in the narthex.

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) has partners around the world who are on the ground working closely with people in the projects we support. Those partners send requests for Quilts and Kits when they see a particularly great need or opportunity for the items to make a real difference. In the past months, our quilts were

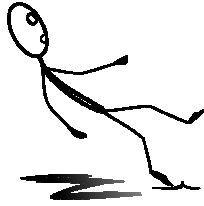

shipped to a holding site. As need arose quilts were distributed to India, Pakistan, Syria, Eritreans and Ukraine. Overall 90,000 refugees and emergency relief persons have been helped through LWR.

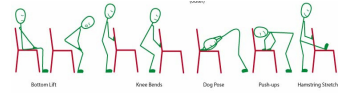
